# Roots of Empathy Begins this week in DIV 4!

The Roots of Empathy program is delivered to elementary school children. This experiential learning is accomplished with the help of a neighbourhood parent and infant. Through guided observation with trained Roots of Empathy instructor, Trish Olin (Shuswap Children's Association), our students label the baby's feelings and intentions.

Through these Family Visits the students are given opportunities to discuss their feelings and listen to the feelings of others. The instructor also visits the classroom the week before and the week after the Family Visit to deliver activities in preparation for and in reflection of the activities of the Family Visit. The curriculum is comprehensive and attuned to the development and interests of the students. The curriculum is divided into nine themes, with three classroom visits supporting each theme (a pre-family visit, family visit and post-family visit) for a total of 27 classes.

The Roots of Empathy activities have many links to the classroom curriculum. For example, students use math skills when they calculate and chart the baby's weight and measurements. Literature is used to open the door to feelings and perspective. Art and music play a large role as children paint their feelings which they cannot say with words and learn about singing to the baby.

Roots of Empathy is an international, evidence and empathy-based classroom program designed for children ages 5 to 13. In Canada, the program is delivered in English and French and reaches rural, urban, and remote communities including Indigenous communities. The program is also in New Zealand, the United States, the Republic of Ireland, England, Wales, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Norway, Switzerland, and Netherlands.
