MAY is "Together We Are Better" Month! (RESPECT and Teamwork)

Hello Silver Creek Families!

This month we are working together as a school team to strengthen our school-wide understandings of our S.T.A.R. behaviour expectations. Silver Creek has been the "Home of the Stars" for years. In honour of this tradition and in honour of learning together we are working on our S.T.A.R. behaviour expectations school wide. We are focusing on our STAR Matrix (attached). This Matrix was developed by staff and every two months, we focus on one of the STAR values.

We start each week with a school-wide Assembly to remind students of the expected behaviour and the theme of the month! Each week (on Fridays) we will draw for prizes from our STAR Tower of Power! (A glass jar where students put their STAR tickets) The plan is to reward as many kind, helpful, and respectful actions, and words we see every day in all our classrooms. Students have been receiving "STAR tickets" from all our staff when they are "caught" being respectful. This is part of the "STARburst" campaign \odot

We are attaching a copy of our Silver Creek S.T.A.R. Chart. The Silver Creek STAR Chart outlines some key expected behaviours that support the best learning and growing environment for our students. We are all using the language "Expected and Unexpected" to describe language and behavior. When everyone knows the expectations, we feel safe and are a stronger team. We are using W.I.T.S. as a strategy for solving problems. (Walk away, Ignore, Talk It Out, Seek Help). This is a powerful tool, especially for our younger students.

What happens if a child makes a mistake? The child will come to the office to sort out the problem and will fill out a reflection sheet, which will be sent home to parents. The office time and the reflection sheet are a chance for us to conference and talk about the positive choices your child is making and as well discuss the areas for improvement. This reflection sheet will show the problem, how your child tried to solve it and suggestions for the future. Depending on the problem, other consequences may occur, and parents will be informed.

In addition, we are using bathroom and break passes to keep the halls orderly and calm. Students wear the bathroom or lanyard pass when they have permission to leave their classroom. We also removed a lot of the items in the hallway, so it is a streamlined walkway.

We welcome your input and ideas! We welcome any questions and can provide clarification on items, as well. Please ask your child if they have received a S.T.A.R. ticket. The tickets will be drawn for prizes each week as a fun way to celebrate together - because... "Together We Are Better!"

We will continue to update our school community, as we add more changes to ensure behaviour is expected and positive at Silver Creek Elementary School. Thank you for being STAR parents, your support is appreciated!
